Our Mission



AIM FOR SEVA

All India Movement for Seva (AIM for Seva) is an organization working to bring about a change amongst the people of India and to care for those who need help.

In the three years since its inception in November 2000, AIM for Seva has made significant inroads into bringing education and a higher standard of living to tribal and poor rural people in the remote districts of India. So far AIM has initiated projects in the fields of education for poor children, hospital and health-care centers, financial empowerment programs for tribal women, road construction, tree planting and water supply projects. These projects are currently benefiting over 100,000 people in several states.

AIM is running a number of educational centers and hostels for children. One particular center in **Uttaranchal** was started in June 2004. The initial roll was for 30 children. But the need for this facility in the community is so great that

within two months of opening, there were more than 70 children regularly attending. The children are provided with free tuition in English, Hindi, sciences, arts and moral and cultural studies. In addition, they are also given very modest dietary supplements. Most of these children are undernourished. The children attend local government schools where education leaves a lot to be desired. These children are from poor families. Many are from families where alcohol and violence play a major part and most of the parents are illiterate.

Currently, AIM is able to appoint only one teacher. The tutoring focus of the centre now is on subjects such as Math, Science and English. AIM for Seva is also looking for assistance to include the many children now on the waiting list for a place at this center. It would also like to provide more nutritious food but at present the budget does not allow it.

The tuition center needs funding of approximately Rs. 99,600 for the upkeep of 100 children per year. Upakriti decided to provide limited funding this project for the following reasons:

1. AIM for Seva is a registered non-profit public charitable trust under Section 80 (G) of Indian Income-Tax Act.

2. While the organization is large with funding from various sources, Upakriti's involvement would be with one of their independent projects, namely supporting this tuition center. The objectives of this tuition center are aligned with Upakriti's mission of enhancing educational opportunities.

3. AIM for Seva has a good track record of success with their existing undertakings.

Upakriti approved funding for AIM for SEVA last quarter. The initial funding for the project is \$150/mo. After few months of evaluation, Upakriti will consider increasing the funding for this project.

Karunai Illam Home, Chennai

Karunai Illam, located in Selayur near Tambaram provides shelter for around hundred children from ages three to seventeen. These young boys and girls, including victims of abuse, neglect and poverty live with only the basic facilities and are offered education until the fifth grade.

Karunai Illam consists of a self-contained home with a kitchen, office, living space, and a playground. This home is run and managed by Mr. Power Singam and his wife. This home needs substantial resources in terms of food and clothing, so there is ample opportunity for contributing to the growth of this project.

Upakriti provided the kids of Karunai Illam with clothes on Upakriti day.
